

# SITUATION IN AFGHANISTAN UNDER THE TALIBAN

#### **HUMAN RIGHTS UNDER THE TALIBAN**

- Kidnapping & forced disappearances (Kabul, Panjshir, Balkhab)
- 4 journalists from Etillat E Roz imprisoned and tortured on the first few days of the regime. Many other journalists were later disappeared or beaten up while reporting.
- Afghanistan Independent Human Rights Commission (AIHRC) was closed
- 36 journalists were imprisoned
- International News outlet #BBCdari and independent



# Afghanistan: Kabul Times reporter detained and attacked

Sayed Rashed Kashefi, a reporter with the Kabul Times and Rasa TV, was allegedly beaten and detained for over six hours while covering a fight at an aid distribution site in Kabul's 5th district. The International Federation of Journalists (IFJ) and its Afghanistan affiliate, the Afghan Independent Journalists' Association (AIJA), condemn the journalist's detention and urge the Taliban authorities to swiftly investigate the incident.



#### **HUMAN RIGHTS UNDER THE TALIBAN**

- Videos of Afghan civilians being killed by the Taliban in broad daylight without any prosecution.
- Torture of ex government employees, ex-security forces, youngsters writing against Taliban on social media, female demonstrators, (Independent Persian, 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022)
- Several deadly attacks carried out by ISIS in Kabul,
  Kandahar and Kunduz
- Attack on minorities , Sikh Temple attacked on June 18 2022





#### **WOMENS' RIGHTS UNDER THE TALIBAN**

- From 28% female members of the Parliament to Zero
- Out of 4 million girls going to school, only 1,5 million are allowed to go in elementary classes.
- 30% or more women in the civil services offices to Zero
- Ministry of women affairs closed and replaced with Ministry of (MORAL POLICING)
- Women were beaten up, phones snatched during demonstrations in Kabul and other cities
- Travel restrictions

**Women** rights activists were abducted from their houses and put into custody for indefinite amount of days without any trial or right to a lawyer.

#### Taliban releases four women's rights activists but fear persists









### ETHNIC INCLUSION/EXCLUSION

- **Exclusion** of other ethnicities such as Tajik, Uzbek and especially the Hazaras from the government.
- Land grabbing by the Taliban in several provinces, mainly the central part of Afghanistan (Daikundi, Bamiyan)
- Forced displacement of Hazaras from Daikundi, Northern Balkh province, Helmand, Uruzgan and Kandahar (HRW, 22<sup>ND</sup> Oct)
- Civilian targeted, forced to flee houses during the internal conflict between the Taliban in #Balkhab



#### **HUMANTARIAN CRISIS IN AFGHANISTAN**

- · 'Major' humanitarian crisis looms in Afghanistan (UN)
- Afghan family sells daughter few months ago for 100,000 afghani each (roughly 830 Euros), to families she doesn't know (Guardian 23 Jan).
- In 2022, 55% of Afghans will face acute food insecurity, including nearly 9 million people at emergency levels one step before famine conditions. Food insecurity is likely to deepen (IRC)
- Natural disaster, Pakitika earthquake

- Situation of Afghan refugees in Europe
- Situation of Afghan refugees in Turkey, deportation
- Situation of Afghan refugees in neighboring countries,
  Iran and Pakistan
- Deportation from Europe to Afghanistan, fears and possibilities.
- Evacuations (Denmark, Macedonia, Serbia, UAE, Qatar, Pakistan)
